



ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT IN HAZARDOUS AREAS

EEHA Refresher - Remote by Application

> No classroom attendance required

OVERVIEW

The Electrical Equipment in Hazardous Areas Refresher course provides licensed electricians who currently hold the Certificate IV in Hazardous Areas – Electrical or EEHA competencies the skills and knowledge to work on explosion protected equipment and systems for the control and monitoring of plant and processes in hazardous areas for the coal, gas and dust industries.

The course will provide continued accreditation to undertake electrical work in a hazardous area and aligns to the requirements outlined in AS/NZS 4761.1 Competencies for working with electrical equipment for hazardous areas (EEHA).

Enrolment includes a comprehensive learner's guide, with technical reference material in full colour.

Student support is available via email, and phone. Dedicated RTO student support staff can answer questions if assistance is required in completing the application kit.

Upon completion of the course, participants will have their existing skills and knowledge refreshed to ensure current competence to:

- Undertake work that meets requirements of AS/NZS 60079.14 and AS/NZS 60079.17
- Read Ex rated equipment name plates and Certificates of Conformity
- Test, install maintain, inspect and attend breakdowns of Ex equipment.

ASSESSMENT REQUIREMENTS

Students will be provided with Refresher Application Kits that include detailed instructions outlining the evidence requirements, and tasks to be completed.

Assessment tasks include:

- question and answer activities
- workplace log book
- telephone interview with assessor

COURSE OUTCOMES

Upon successful completion of this course, participants will be given a Refresher Certificate. This certificate should be coupled with the participant's Statement of Attainment as evidence that refresher training has been undertaken.

COURSE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

The short course Electrical Equipment in Hazardous Areas Refresher delivered by Verico Training Services is for existing workers in industry who have current experience working in and around hazardous areas. Students must:

- Hold a Statement of Attainment for relevant EEHA units or a Certificate IV in Hazardous Areas – Electrical (UEE42611)
- Be existing industry employees working as licensed electricians
- Be able to provide a copy of their current electrical industry licence
- Be over the age of 18 years.

REFRESHER TRAINING

In accordance with the AS/NZS 60079.14 for continuing education + AS/NZS 2290.1:2014, Verico Training Services recommends that the EEHA competencies are refreshed every 2-3 years.

FURTHER STUDY

For continuing training and development, participants may wish to enrol in additional units towards completion of the full Certificate IV in Hazardous areas – Electrical (UEE42611).

COURSE FEES, PAYMENTS AND REFUNDS

- For course fees over \$1,500, payment plans are available to students funding their own course fees. The course deposit will not exceed \$1,500.
- Refunds may be made in the following circumstances:
- Participants are enrolled in training that has been terminated by the RTO
- Participant advises the RTO more than seven days prior to course commencement they are withdrawing from the course
- If the participant withdraws from a course or program, prior to course commencement, due to illness or extreme hardship as determined by the RTO
- In the event that the RTO fails to provide the agreed services.
- An administration fee is required to be paid prior to course commencement, which is included within the deposit fee. If the student withdraws from the course prior to course commencement, they will forfeit this administration fee but may be entitled to a refund of the remaining deposit.
- No refunds will be issued once the student has commenced the course.
- If a student requires a reissue of their Certificate or Statement of Attainment, a certificate reissue fee of \$80 will be charged.
- If a student is deemed not yet competent on completion of training, they will be offered an opportunity to be reassessed. If a student is deemed not yet competent a second time, they will be given another opportunity for reassessment.
